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Introduction


Scope and Purpose

This document describes the system requirements, installation and configuration steps for the Cloud Virtual Smart Tap(cVST) and Instance Smart Tap(iST) on the Public Cloud, Physical Server, or Desktop.

Pre-requisite: It is assumed that the reader has already installed the Uila Virtual Information Controller (VIC) and the Uila Management and Analytics Server (UMAS).

Architecture Overview

The diagram below shows the Uila Management and Analytics System architecture (UMAS) and its relationship to Private and Public cloud environment.



Uila Architecture

Uila consists of three major components –

Management and Analytics system(UMAS) – UMAS is a big data store and analytics
engine that was designed to accommodate a large data center deployment with
thousands of servers. UMAS can store data for up to 35 days and record data in
minute resolution, while maintaining real time responsiveness. UMAS's built-in
redundancy offers high availability, removes downtime and reduces maintenance
overhead.



The UMAS can be used to provide a single pane of glass view for end-to-end visibility into performance, capacity and resource usage/allotments across all on-premise and cloud-hosted services (VMware, Microsoft Hyper-V, Amazon Web Services, Microsoft Azure, Google Cloud and other cloud provider deployments).

- Virtual Information Controller(vIC) vIC is installed as a virtual appliance on-premise or on cloud datacenter. The vIC retrieves the infrastructure configuration and collects network, storage and compute performance metrics. This is then combined with the data from the vST and transmitted to the UMAS.
- Virtual Smart Tap(vST) Virtual Smart Tap (vST) is deployed in a distributed manner across the Data Center or the Public Cloud. The vST installs in the host (Private Cloud) or VM/instance (Public Cloud) or Kubernetes Node as an efficiently designed guest Virtual Machine or Pod where it promiscuously listens to all traffic from the virtual switch or getting traffic from Uila's Instance Smart Tap (iST) that traverses the virtual networks (North-South and East-West). Using embedded Deep Packet Inspection (DPI) technology, the vST identifies unique applications and their attributes.

In a cloud deployment, the VST (a.k.a cVST), also collects the network and performance metrics from the IST and utilizes the Deep Packet inspection technology to identify applications.

Instance Smart Tap (IST) – The Uila Instance Smart Tap (iST) is deployed as a plug-in
in a distributed manner across the Public Cloud on the VMs or Instances running the
application workload. It collects traffic as well as VM and Instance level Compute
statistics and sends it to the vST for Deep Packet Inspection.

Getting Started

System Requirements for cVST/IST


User must provision and setup a Ubuntu appliance from marketplace and setup the following network requirements before installing Uila.

- Uila Virtual Smart Tap (vST) requirements
 - cVST for Public Cloud -
 - t2.large for AWS
 - D2s v3 for Azure
 - 4Gb minimum disk space required
 - 1G RAM + 512M x each IST (i.e. 5 iST = 3.5G RAM)
 - Ubuntu (Recommended Ubuntu 20.04)
 - Create an account with sudo permissions



- Network requirement
 - Allocate one IP address for each of the cVST's. This can be either a static IP address or assigned via DHCP, prior to the deployment.
 - The IST's will be installed as an agent inside the guest OS. It will use the IP address assigned to the guest OS.
- Port Requirements: VERY IMPORTANT to verify the following Ports are opened to allow Uila software to communicate.
- cVST must be able to initiate traffic to the VIC IP

Uila Solution for Public Cloud Deployment



Deploy Uila Virtual Smart Tap

- 1. Setup a brand new VM/Instance for the cVST. The recommended guest OS is Ubuntu 20.04.
- 2. Make sure to set the hostname of the cVST, making sure it is unique.
 - a. With sudo access run:
 - hostnamectl set-hostname "Auto-VST-1"
- 3. Upload the VST installer to the VM
 - a. The installer file will be provided by Uila and its name would resemble "installer-vst.tar.gz"
 - b. Upload the Uila Installer file to "/opt"
- 4. Execute the vST installation -




- a. Run the commands
 - i. tar -xvf installer-vst.tar.gz
 - ii. cd UilaInstaller/
 - iii. ./install.sh -rpcap deployment.properties
- 5. Configure the cloud vST
 - a. Run the command
 - i. /opt/uila/VST/bin/setconfig -v < VIC IP address>
 - ii. /opt/uila/VST/bin/setconfig -t cloud
- 6. Make sure package 'unzip' is installed, if not install it.
 - a. Run the command
 - i. sudo apt install unzip
- 7. Now go to finish the cloud VST configuration
 - a. Go to Uila GUI>>Settings>>VST configuration
 - b. Click on Cloud VST
 - c. You will see a list of the running Cloud VST
 - d. Under "Actions" click on "config"
 - e. Fill in the field below to identify the cloud VST
 - f. The account must have 'sudo' rights to perform service-related operations



- 8. If cloning a VST to be the cVST, here are some notes
 - a. Find a VST that does not have transaction analysis, no 2nd HD
 - b. If there are multiple NICs, make sure to delete all the unnecessary NICs
 - c. For 4 IST instances, requires 3G RAM, 2 cores, 3GB HD.





- d. Get rid of the unneeded NIC config:
- e. Modify /etc/network/interfaces to remove links to the other NIC.
- f. Other possibility, vi /etc/netplan/00-installer-config.yaml to only have one NIC and IP

g. Make sure there is only 1 /opt/uila/VST/conf/uvst-rpcap.conf

h. And contents of the file uvst-rpcap.conf should similar to this:

- i. Running the cVST installer should make those settings into the uvst-rpcap.conf.
- j. To enable Uila to use the 'root' account, modify /opt/uila/VST/conf/ssh/sshd_config to change this line from : PermitRootLogin without-password

To:

PermitRootLogin yes

- k. To allow 'uila' account to have root access, modify the sudoer file:
 - i. Run visudo and add this line after the 'root' line: uila ALL=(ALL:ALL) ALL
- Change the permission for the Uila (or custom account) to have sudo Run visudo
- m. Comment out the 'uila' setting and add this new line at bottom:


Deploy Uila Instance Smart Tap (IST) for Windows

Starting with version 5.6, Uila will now auto assign IST to the cVST. It is based on the VAPP_NAME and PG_NAME set into the IST configuration. Once the IST communicate with the VIC, VIC will search for and assign the IST to an available cVST that matches the above names. You can use VAPP and/or PG to further distinguish which cVST.




If no names are defined (default), then VIC will search for a cVST that has a name of 'default'.





Installation


- 1. Download the IST install image (i.e. installer-ist-windows.zip) and copy it onto the target system. This image will be provided by Uila.
- 2. Install the iST on the target VM
 - a. Unzip the IST install package to a local directory (i.e. c:\TEMP\uila-ist-win) of the target system.
 - b. Launch PowerShell as Administrator



- c. Change directory to the Windows file folder containing uila-ist-win.ps1.
- d. Run the command below in PowerShell console to install iST set-executionpolicy -executionpolicy bypass -scope process -force; .\uila-ist.ps1 -Install -VIC 192.168.0.101 -vapp_name 'vdi' -pg_name 'west'
- e. If no specific cVST is needed then no need to specify the vapp or pg_name. set-executionpolicy -executionpolicy bypass -scope process -force; .\ulla-ist.ps1 -Install -VIC 192.168.0.101



f. You can verify the setting in the c:/Program Files/Uila/server.conf.



NOTE:

To uninstall the iST package:

set-executionpolicy -executionpolicy bypass -scope process -force; .\uila-ist.ps1 -uninstall

g. Verify if the Uila Service is up and running. Open Windows Services as an administrator. Or run services.msc






Start both Uila iST Service and Uila iST Update Service if they're not running already.




- 3. Go to the Uila Webpage
 - a. Settings>>VST Configuration
 - b. Click on Cloud VST
 - c. You will see the Cloud VST appear
 - d. Under "Actions" click on "config"
 - e. Fill in the login information to identify the cloud VST
 - f. Click Next
 - g. Define the correct vApp and Port Group name that you want ISTs to be assigned to



- h. If there are already ISTs deployed from prev versions, use the label 'default' for both vAPP and pg names. This will allow the default ISTs to get assigned and software to auto update.
- i. Click Next
- Set the max number of slots for this cVST. This number (default==40) is based on how much memory and cpu is assigned to this cVST.






- k. The base formula to use is:
 - 1G + slot x 512 meg

So for 40 slots, the recommended memory is 21Gs of RAM and 4-8 CPU. If the RAM is less, adjust the slot number to prevent ISTs from being assigned to this cVST.

I. If there are more ISTs than cVST(slots), you should replicate another cVST with the same vApp/Pg name so additional ISTs can be assigned to this cVST. Like in this case, there are 3 cVST serving the same vApp/Pg:



m. In this example, there are 2 IST that has vapp/pg names defined and assigned, and 2 IST that are default (no vapp/pg names shown). And there are no default cVST created, so those ISTs are not assigned.





Deploy Uila Instance Smart Tap for Linux

- 1. Supported OS
 - a. Centos/RedHat 6 8
 - b. Ubuntu 14 20
- 2. Upload the IST installer to the VM
 - a. The installer file will be provided by Uila and its name would resemble "installer-ist-linux.tar.gz"
 - b. Create a folder "/opt" on the target PC and Upload the Uila Installer file to "/opt"
- 3. Execute iST installation
 - a. tar -xvf installer-ist-linux.tar.gz
 - b. cd UilaInstaller/
 - c. If you do not need to group ISTs to specific cVST: ./install.sh –vic <vic ip> deployment.properties
 - d. If you do want to assign this IST to a specific cVST, add the names: ./install.sh –vic <vic ip> -vapp_name 'vdi' -pg_name 'west' deployment.properties
 - e. You can check the settings in the file /opt/uila/IST/conf/server.conf to check if they are set to the correct VIC, vapp_name and pg_name. You can manually change this in future to set to different cVST.
